

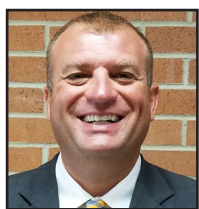

Treasurer’s Financial Update

Dear Northmor Golden Knight Community,

As we begin another exciting school year, I want to thank our students, families, staff, and community members for your continued support of Northmor Local Schools. It is a privilege to serve a district that is committed to academic excellence, fiscal responsibility, and putting students first.

I am pleased to report that Northmor Local Schools closed Fiscal Year 2026 in a strong financial position. The General Fund began the year with a cash balance of \$5.58 million, received \$16.59 million in revenues, and incurred \$15.48 million in expenditures. Through careful fiscal management and responsible budgeting, the District ended the fiscal year with an increased cash balance of \$6.68 million, an improvement of more than \$1.1 million. This positive result reflects the Board of Education’s commitment to sound financial stewardship and provides a solid foundation as we prepare for future financial challenges.

Each year, the Board of Education reviews a Five-Year Financial Forecast that serves as a roadmap for the District’s financial future. This forecast helps us plan responsibly while preparing for changes that may impact school funding.

This year’s forecast reflects one of the most significant changes to Ohio school funding in decades. Recent state legislation has changed how school property taxes are calculated and limited future revenue growth for school districts. Because Northmor operates at Ohio’s 20-mill floor, these changes are expected to have a considerable impact on our local revenues. Based on current estimates, the District could experience nearly \$5 million in reduced property tax revenue through Fiscal Year 2031. While the Ohio Department of Taxation continues to finalize the implementation of these laws, our forecast has been prepared using the best information currently available.

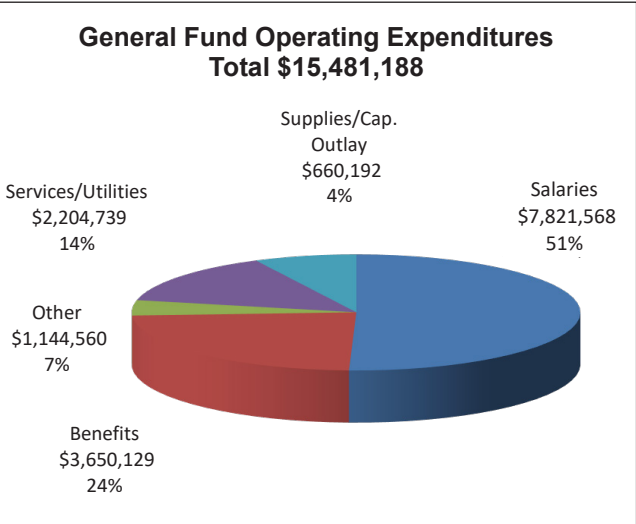
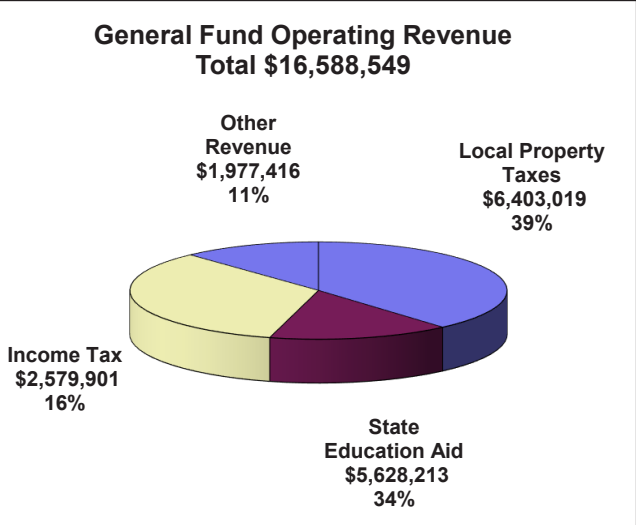
Despite these challenges, Northmor Local Schools remains on solid financial footing. Through careful budgeting, conservative financial planning, and responsible stewardship of taxpayer dollars, we continue to maintain the financial stability necessary to support our students, invest in our facilities, and provide high-quality educational opportunities.

Our administration and Board of Education will continue to closely monitor state legislation, property tax changes, and school funding updates while making thoughtful decisions that prioritize student success and protect the long-term financial health of our District.

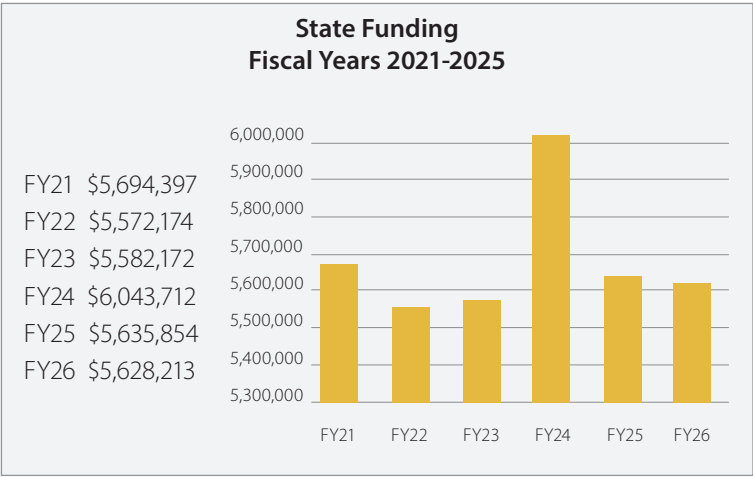
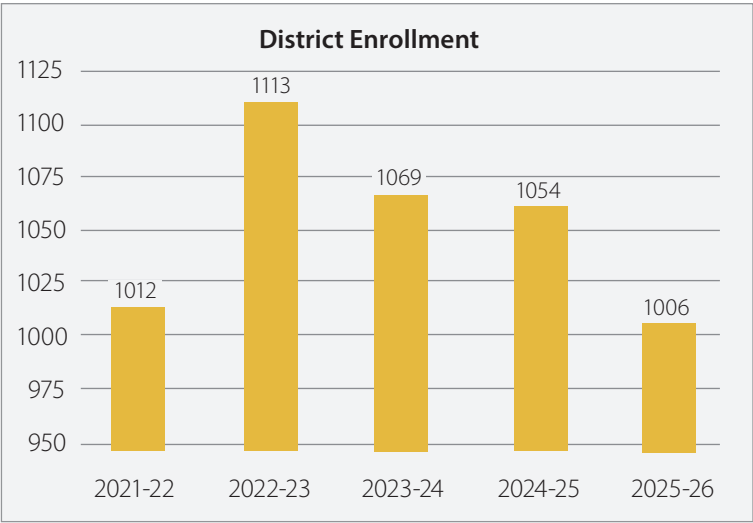
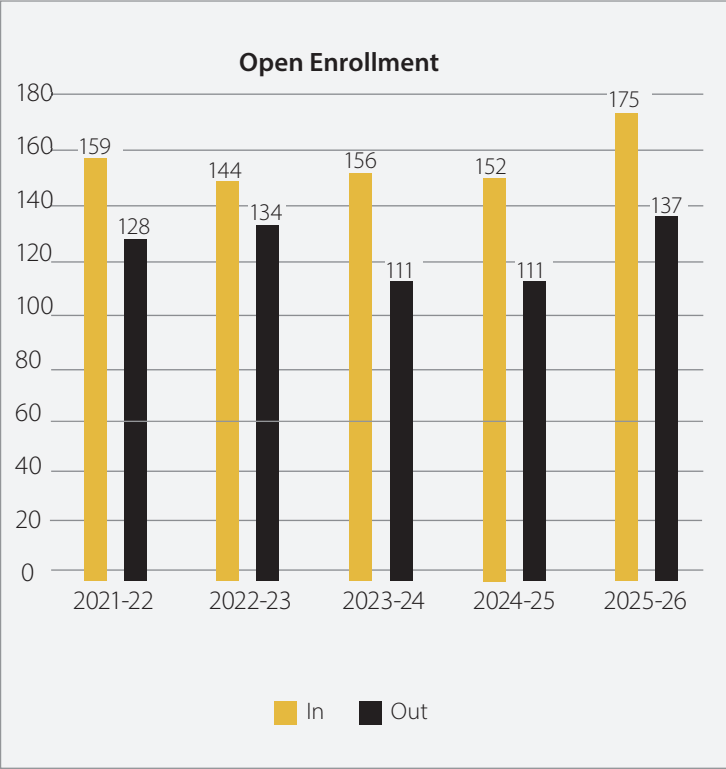

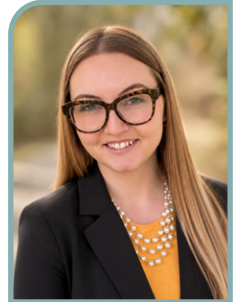
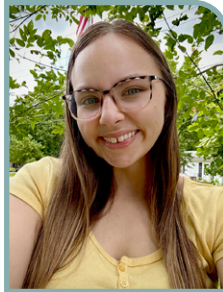


Cody Taylor

I am excited for the opportunity to be a part of the Northmor community and look forward to a great school year filled with learning, growth, and success.



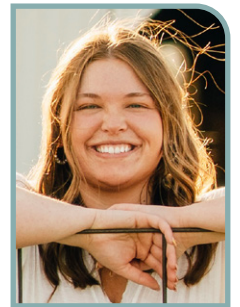
Chloe Berg

As we look towards the 2026-2027 sports year and what will surely be an exciting fall sports season, not much has changed in terms of viewing experience. Adult tickets for varsity events have stayed at \$8.00 per ticket. Student tickets also remain at \$5.00. Subvarsity (i.e. junior high and JV contests) are \$5.00 and \$3.00. Our season ticket prices for home (regular season) events have increased slightly. Most passes have increased by \$15. Some have moved less, others a bit more. This is due to the rising cost of officials, invite fees, and general athletic expenses. However, we do our best to keep these prices reasonable. Compared to neighboring districts, our passes are very competitive. If you plan to attend many events, whether throughout the year or simply during a specific season, these season ticket prices will save you money. Season passes, whether all year or season-specific, are always on sale! Please reach out via email or through the school, and we can set up a time for those to be purchased.

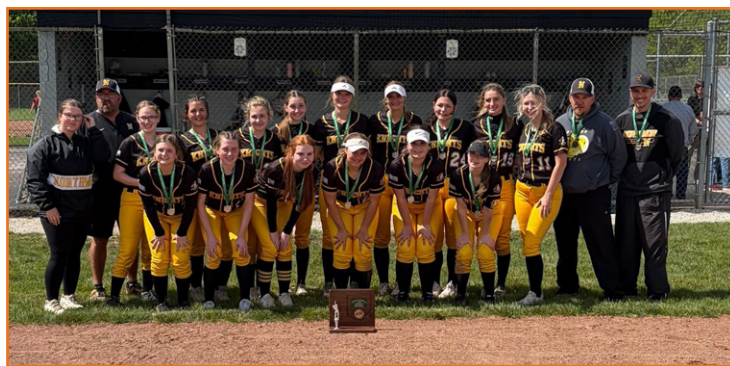

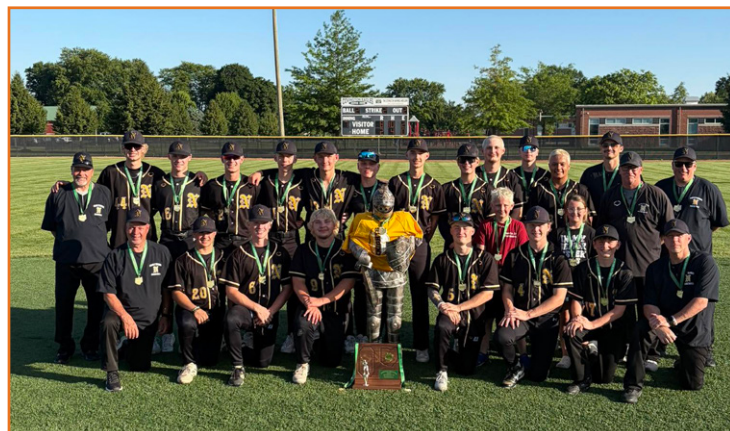
